

SPECIFY NSF-140 PLATINUM CERTIFIED NEXTERRA® CARPET TILES FOR LEED® CREDIT UNDER INNOVATION IN DESIGN

The USGBC, United States Green Building Council, offers to design teams and projects the opportunity to be awarded points for exceptional performance above the requirements set by the LEED Green Building Rating System and/or innovative performance in Green Building categories not specifically addressed by the LEED Green Building Rating System.

The new sustainable carpet assessment standard – **NSF/ANSI 140-2007** – the only one of its kind for the floor covering industry, establishes performance requirements for public health and the environment and addresses the critical economic, environmental and social requirements that can help create a path to a more sustainable carpet product.

You will obtain the highest Innovation point when specifying Nexterra carpet tiles because **ALL** Nexterra carpet tiles are certified at the Platinum level.

First – *Specify any Nexterra carpet tile for your building (all carpet in the project must hold a NSF-140 2007 Certification, to apply for an Innovation point).*

Second – *Compare materials cost against total cost of all building products used in the project. (if your purchase of Nexterra carpet tiles meet at least 1.25% of the overall project material budget, you are eligible to apply for this point.)*

Third - *Complete the correct documentation for the Innovation point.*

That's it. Nexterra Tiles = Innovation.
